

RMP FIELD PROJECT CRITERIA

Field Project Justification

- 1) Provides malaria control/elimination through one or more of the following:*
 - a) Diagnosis and treatment,
 - b) Transmission prevention,
 - c) Environmental management,
 - d) Public education,
 - e) Support for local institutions that manage/coordinate field project implementation.
- 2) Has the sponsorship of local Rotarians.*
- 3) Provides for the sustainability of project impact over the long run by beneficiaries & /or local health authorities.*
- 4) Includes objectives to be achieved by the project and means by which the achievement of those objectives will be measured.*
- 5) Establishes &/or nurtures relationships with strong partners.** (NGOs, government agencies, church and business groups)
- 6) Serves as a model for scaled up malaria control/elimination.**
- 7) Expands the involvement of Rotarians in malaria control/elimination.**

*Essential justification for RMP field project selection.

** Desirable justification for RMP field project selection

Field Project Success Criteria

- 1) Malaria incidence, mortality or related disease reduction quantitative and qualitative objectives are met.
- 2) Number of people reached through public education is documented and the effectiveness of the education demonstrated.
- 3) Rotarians played significant, appropriate role in project implementation and achievement of objectives.
- 4) RMP realizes MARCOM benefits from project.
- 5) NGO &/or other key partner relationships are established or reinforced through the project.
- 6) Resulted in or will result in new projects using the same model or a larger "scaled up" project.
